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Describe the goal(s) or purpose(s) of the organization:

Physical literacy is the motivation, confidence, physical competence, knowledge, and understanding to value and take responsibility for engagement in physical activities for life. Physically literate individuals are more likely to engage in regular physical activity and experience its associated benefits. Formed in 2019 under the Sport for Life Physical Literacy for Communities (PL4C) Project, our focus is to create awareness of physical literacy and its importance in living a healthy, active life as well as to promote the development and training of physical literacy skills in members of Shuswap communities. As noted on page 15 in the City of Salmon Arm Parks and Recreation Master Plan 2012 "lack of physical activity is a major public health concern throughout BC, with the most recent data indicating that 38% of British Columbians are not active enough to achieve the health benefits associated with an active lifestyle." Additionally, in section 4.2, the Master Plan indicates that by using the The Canadian Sport for Life model (CS4L), "The goal is for Salmon Arm to build a community that enjoys lifelong participation in a variety of recreational sport and physical activities, whether at a competitive level or just for fun and health. The CS4L methods aim to help children and youth develop physical literacy and build a positive association with fitness and sport."

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

## P.L.A.Y. Shuswap -2023 AGM REPORT

Vision: Move Together. Live Better. For Life

Mission: Providing sustainable physical literacy opportunities for our communities to be active

through life.

We are a non-profit organization made up of recreation, health, sport and education stakeholders from 3 communities: Enderby, Salmon Arm and Sicamous. We provide sustainable physical literacy opportunities for our communities to be active through life. We're a local network of people committed to building healthy, active, and physically literate communities in the Shuswap area. Our members represent education, health, recreation, sport and community sectors. We meet regularly to advance opportunities to inform professionals in our sectors and Shuswap residents about the benefits of developing and maintaining physical literacy throughout our lives. PLAY Shuswap was formed in 2019 as part of the Sport for Life Physical Literacy for communities project.

In the spring of 2021, we started the process of becoming our own independent society separate from the guidance of Sport for Life which would allow us to apply for different levels of funding and grants to run physical literacy programs and promotions. We applied for and obtained our Certificate of Incorporation (Number: S0075819). While we were obtaining our non-profit status, another local non-profit (Shuswap Trail Alliance) managed our funds for us until we were able to open our own bank account and we thank them for their assistance to our organization. Another of our goals achieved for the fiscal year 2021-2022 was to create three physical literacy kits that were to be distributed to our community recreation centers in Enderby, Sicamous and Salmon Arm to be used within their programs and to be loaned out to local community groups.

We continue to look for opportunities to apply for grants to promote physical literacy awareness, development and training for our communities and to participate in local events in the coming years.

We have hired two part-time positions for the organization; an Administrative Coordinator and Programs Coordinator. The Administrative Coordinator has assisted the organization in applying for grants, bookkeeping and general administrative duties. Our Programs Coordinator has organized community outreach and programs including a Play Shuswap Open House.

Through our coordinators and summer students we plan to increase our public outreach and provide more opportunities to inform professionals in our sectors of the importance of physical literacy.
