Subject: Traffic Amendment Bylaw No. 4610
Ticket Information Amendment No. 4611

MOTION FOR CONSIDERATION:

THAT: the Bylaw entitled City of Salmon Arm Traffic Amendment Bylaw No. 4610 be read a first, second and third time;

AND THAT: the Bylaw entitled City of Salmon Arm Ticket Information Amendment Bylaw No. 4611 be read a first, second and third time.

BACKGROUND:

Parks and Open Space Bylaw 4609 seeks to repeal and replace the 1993 Parks Regulation Bylaw.

The Traffic Amendment Bylaw No. 4610 and the Ticket Information Amendment Bylaw No. 4611 are consequential amendments that result from the adoption of Bylaw 4609.

Bylaw 4610, which amends the Traffic Bylaw, duplicates the provisions from Bylaw 4609 that limit the placement of temporary shelters, and duplicate all of the provisions in Bylaw 4609 that relate to the seizure and disposal of chattels that are abandoned on City road rights of way. In this manner, these issues are dealt with in a consistent manner, regardless of whether or not the temporary shelter or abandoned chattels occur on parks, open spaces or active road rights of way.

Bylaw 4611 amends the Ticket Information Utilization Bylaw so that the new infractions outlined under Bylaw 4609 have specified fines and penalties that can be levied.
